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Quorum was not met for this meeting, therefore no decisions were made. Discussion notes are provided below.

The group discussed the current format of CEAC with the following comments:

- Feels it falls low on priorities for members; need to find out why
- Good to have one committee, mandate hasn't been changed that much
- Need to re-motivate the committee
- **Garth will call each member and discuss what their plans are for CEAC. If they don't wish to continue, new members should be solicited. He will also ask if there is interest in providing feedback for the Participatory Budget Rulebook (previous PB Committee included: Garth, Albert, Kathy and JoAnn)**
- Suggested that the sub-committees continue with their schedules; consider CEAC moving to quarterly meetings
- Rob will assign an alternate Councillor
- **MLA Rosendahl is not available on May 11<sup>th</sup> to appear as a delegation for CEAC. Check to see what day he is available and book meeting around his schedule**
  - o Ask what infrastructure funding is available?
- Discussions occurred on the highway corridor. It was suggested to look into the CN grants that are available on a yearly basis, can possibly provide trees to screen yard
- **Rob to look into who owns the boulevards and what it would cost to replace with concrete. He will also find out who owns the light stands (can we put flags on them)**
- Group needs to look at short-medium-long terms actions for some easy wins
- Pride of ownership clause should be included for business owners
- Pitch In is next week; Rob informed the group that the Town provides free gloves and bags for those picking up garbage
- **Rob to find out about the tree planting that was budgeted for last year that didn't occur**
- **Rob to speak with Mike regarding the meeting being held the last week of April where the various plans will be discussed**
- The group discussed the potential of building a trail from Hinton to the Jasper National Park border. It was suggested that the HMBA may be a good contact for this project. If TransMountain is approved, they look for ways of giving back. This may be an opportunity
- The Kinder Morgan MOU is to improve the parking lot at the mountain bike park
