On February 13, 2025, the Town of Hinton government services began experiencing network connectivity issues, which we immediately sought to investigate and resolve with the support of IT and cybersecurity experts. We have determined these issues are the result of a cybersecurity incident.

We are working closely with cybersecurity experts to manage this incident and mitigate any potential impacts. The Town considers the security and privacy of its IT systems and information to be of the utmost importance. We will share relevant information as it becomes available and follow all applicable privacy laws.


Off-Leash Dog Safety

Dogs must always be under control to ensure the safety and enjoyment of our community spaces, even in off-leash areas.

A dog is under control when it responds immediately to voice, sound, or sight commands; does not attack, bite, chase, threaten or injure a person or another animal; and does not cause damage to property.

Help ensure Hinton's outdoor spaces remain safe and enjoyable: keep your dog under control. Get information about responsible pet ownership and maps of off-leash areas at Hinton.ca/Animals.
